



US 89 - Timberline Trail to Deadman Flat Road

PAVEMENT PRESERVATION

OVERVIEW

The Arizona Department of Transportation has initiated a pavement preservation project along US 89 between Timberline Trail and Deadman Flat Road north of Flagstaff (mileposts 425-435).

PROJECT ELEMENTS

The purpose of the project is to extend the life of the roadway by removing and replacing the top layer of existing pavement as well as making spot repairs and pothole repairs and applying new pavement markings.

PROJECT SCHEDULE

Construction is expected to begin late spring 2024 and be completed in late fall 2024.

WHAT TO EXPECT

- ▶ While paving work is underway, daytime lane restrictions will be in place from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. Mondays through Thursdays, and Fridays from 5 a.m. to noon, as needed.
- ▶ No work is anticipated on weekends or holidays.
- ▶ Throughout the paving work, a minimum of one lane in each direction will be maintained.

ADOT advises drivers to plan for possible delays while the work is underway.
